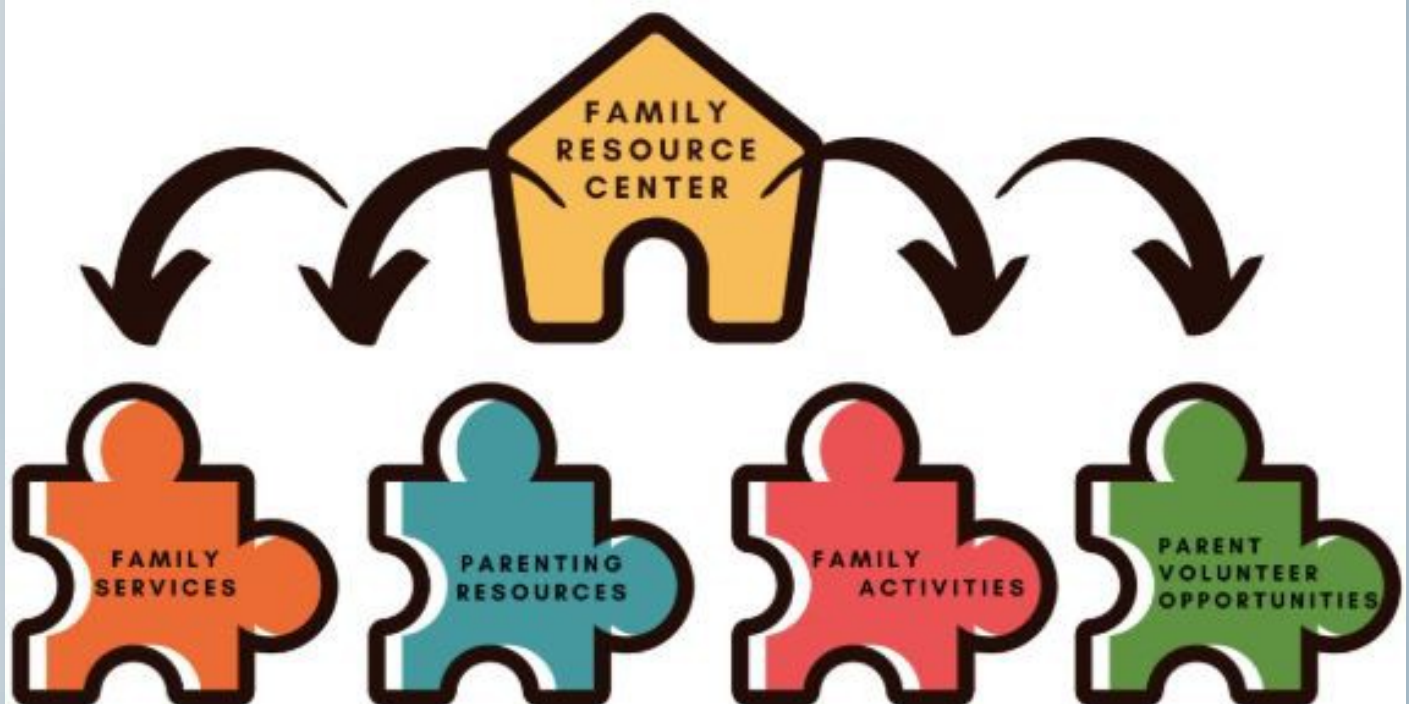

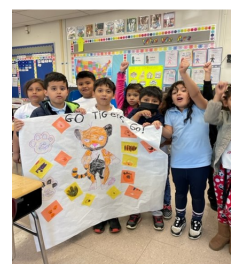

The Humanities team is dedicated to supporting your child's learning journey through a variety of initiatives:

- **Teacher Support:** We provide ongoing professional development, coaching, and collaborative opportunities for teachers to enhance their instructional practices.

Building Literacy at Home

We believe that literacy development starts at home. Here are some ways you can support your child's reading and writing skills:

- Daily Reading: Read aloud with your child for at least 15-20 minutes each day.
- Library Visits: Regularly visit the library to borrow books and participate in reading programs.
- Active Engagement: Ask questions about the story, discuss characters, and connect the story to your child's experiences.
- Phonics & Phonemic Awareness: Focus on letter-sound correspondence and identifying sounds in words (especially for K-2).
- Vocabulary Building: Introduce new words, discuss their meanings, and encourage their use.
- Fluency Practice: Repeatedly read the same book to improve reading speed and accuracy.
- Reading Comprehension: Help your child understand the meaning of the text by asking questions and discussing key concepts.
- Set Reading Goals: Create challenges and reward your child for reading milestones.
- Encourage Writing: Foster a love of writing by encouraging your child to write stories, letters, and poems.
- Lead by Example: Demonstrate the joy of reading by reading for pleasure yourself.
- Teacher Communication: Stay in touch with your child's teacher to discuss their progress and receive personalized support recommendations.

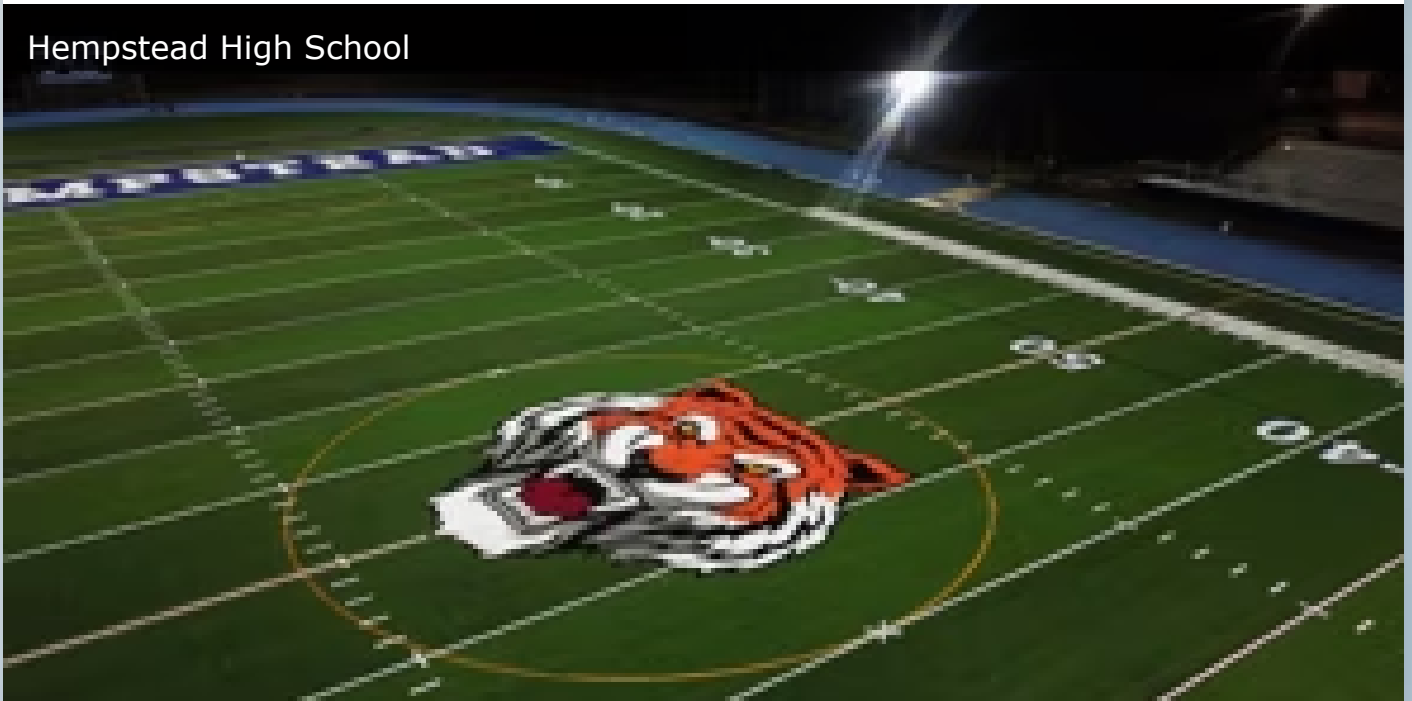
