



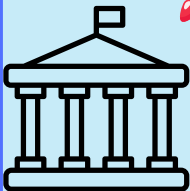

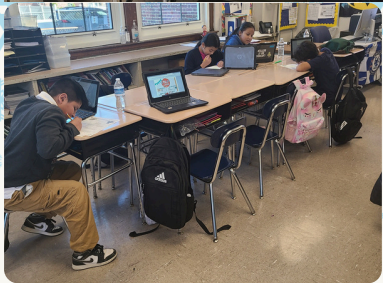
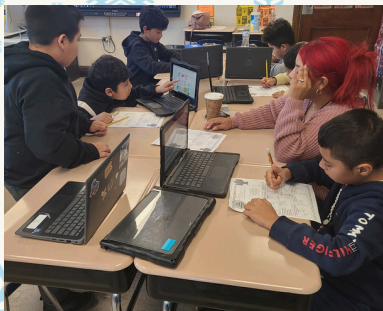

Coats from all over Long Island were donated to help give coats to people in need of one for the upcoming winter. Our school government helped administer coats as well to families.

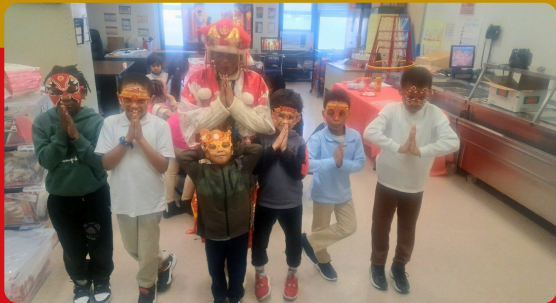
This teaches our young scholars to be giving, caring, and spreading agency to the community. Thank you Mr. Mitnick for your support!



Lunar New Year Celebration



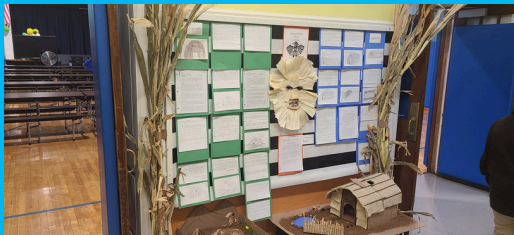

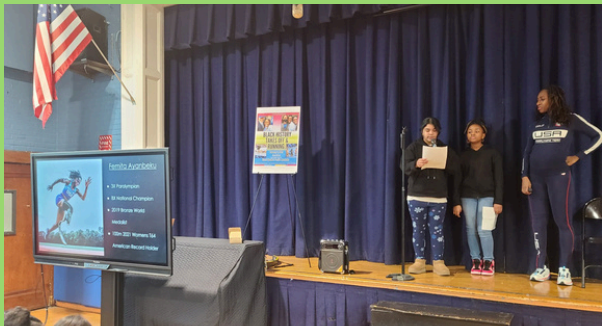

On February 3, 2025 Femita Ayanbeku was invited to Jackson School by our Student Government body. Femita is an American paralympic athlete. We had many visitors including "Girls on the Run" from Joseph Mc Neil. We had question & answer session. Many students had a chance to ask the athlete questions. Femita shared her life story through a power point presentation. When Femita was 11 she got into a car accident. Unfortunately, she lost her right leg. At the age of 23 she received a running blade. Femita discovered her passion for running.

Femita Ayanbeku and is an American Paralympic athlete. Now, she is a personal Trainer and received a certification through ACE. This young lady gave a motivational lesson which I think will really help us in our lives.

Ms. Ayanbeku is an inspiring person who has overcome many challenges in her life. Even though she faced tough situations, she kept going and turned those struggles into lessons. Her story shows others that it's possible to rise above difficulties and achieve success. This paralympic encourages people, especially women, to be strong, face challenges with confidence and to never give up. Through her examples, she helps others believe in themselves and shows that obstacles can lead to growth and success.

The Lesson I learned was to "always believe in yourself." I learned that Femita Ayanbeku always believed in herself even when others discouraged her. Another lesson I learned was "always have faith". She had faith even when she lost her right leg.
